

RULES TO FOLLOW DURING THE INTERVIEW

As provided for by art. 5 of the call for admission to the XXXIX cycle of PhD courses at the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia, below are the guidelines to be strictly followed during the interview via Google Meet:

1. Connect at <https://meet.google.com/yot-ddtt-dzn> at least 10 minutes before the meeting starts and allow the browser or app to use microphone and camera
2. Connection to videoconferencing implies acceptance of the method for holding the interview at a distance, according to the procedures described in the Guidelines adopted by the University, which can be consulted at <https://www.unimore.it/online/studente.html>
3. The candidate is aware that misconduct in breach of the University's Student Regulations or the regulations in force will be sanctioned by exclusion from the interview. **It is forbidden to record one's own and others' interviews.**
4. The applicant must interview in a room alone. If possible, the workstation should be configured as follows: the PC/device is placed on a table on which the student's mobile phone/smartphone and any additional material authorized by the teacher, necessary for the test, are placed.
5. To respect the candidate's privacy, it is suggested that the table be placed approximately 1.5 meters from the wall and that the candidate sits in front of the PC/device with his/her back facing the wall.
6. The candidate should not use headphones or earphones. In addition, the candidate must never turn off the camera during the test. The Commission proceeds with the questions and the candidate is required to answer by looking at the camera and keeping his/her hands in the frame.
7. In the event of a loss of connection or repeated interruptions, the Commission will assess and decide on the validity of the test, considering the part of the interview already carried out and seeking solutions to complete the test.

8. At the end of the interview, the candidate deactivates the microphone and video camera of the PC/device and may leave the videoconference, unless there are specific requirements.
